WHERE THE MONEY GOES

In case you were wondering where the proceeds go from our year-round fundraising efforts:



\$25,000 - **University of Maine Foundation to the Pelagic Fisheries Lab**. These funds provide internships for 6 students working at the Lab and toward Bluefin tuna research led by Dr. Walt Golet.

\$18,000 - Foundation for Maine's Community Colleges. Eighteen students enrolled in trades and marine science programs at Maine's 7 community colleges will each receive \$1,000 scholarships to continue their education.

\$10,000 - Lyndsay Withers Memorial Scholarship. This money will help build our endowment to ensure medical first responders in Maine's rural communities have the proper training and credentials they need.

\$5,000 - **Foundation for Maine's Community Colleges.** This will fulfill our endowment so there will always be scholarships for community college trade students.
